

GE HealthCare lobbying & trade association disclosure policy

GE HealthCare is working to solve the greatest challenges in healthcare that patients and clinicians face today and in the future. Together, we are not only building a healthier future but living our purpose to create a world where healthcare has no limits. Public policy has a direct impact on the work that we do. Therefore, colleagues engage with public officials to advance smart health and technology policy at all levels of government – local, state, and federal. Colleagues educate officials on GE HealthCare’s operations, emerging technologies and markets, as well as on our views on public policy issues. All advocacy done by our colleagues on pending U.S. legislation is included in our quarterly Lobbying Disclosure Act (LDA) filings.

GE HealthCare conducts lobbying activities in compliance with applicable laws and regulations governing such activities. In the U.S., certain communications with federal, state, and/or local government officials or government employees may be reportable as lobbying communications included in GE HealthCare’s LDA reports and/or state or local lobbying disclosure reports. Certain countries outside the United States may also require disclosure of lobbying activities.

Prior approval from GE HealthCare’s U.S. Head of Government Affairs & Policy is required before the company may retain an outside entity to engage in lobbying activities. Further, before participating in lobbying activities, colleagues are asked to contact GE HealthCare’s U.S. Head of Government Affairs & Policy. GE HealthCare trains colleagues in types of activities and communications that constitute reportable lobbying activities.
